MONTE VISTA WATER DISTRICT CELEBRATES CALIFORNIA'S WATER PROFESSIONALS APPRECIATION WEEK, SHOWCASES CAREERS IN WATER

MONTCLAIR, CA Last week, Monte Vista Water District participated in Water Professionals Appreciation Week, a campaign celebrated the second week of October in order to bring attention to jobs in the water industry and to recognize those who work in the field. The campaign launched last year by the California state legislature to bring attention to the nearly 60,000 people who work in the water industry in California alone.

The district kicked off the campaign by passing a resolution, which proclaimed Oct. 6 to 14 as Water Professionals Appreciation Week.

"The job that our staff performs on a daily basis to keep safe, reliable drinking water flowing to our customers' homes and businesses is so important and deserves to be celebrated," said President of the Board of Directors, Sandra Rose. "Water professionals at public water and wastewater agencies work 24/7 to maintain and upgrade our systems and without them, a high-quality water supply would not be possible."

During the celebratory week, the agency took part in a series of activities that included public outreach, water education, and employee appreciation. The district's Facebook page and website featured staff members' bios, showcasing their photos, job duties and fun facts about them. Additionally, staff was recognized internally through various district-sponsored activities that highlighted the important role the agency plays in ensuring safe, reliable water to its community.

The district has also partnered with Montclair High School on its upcoming Career Day event, held Oct. 24, to promote careers in water.
