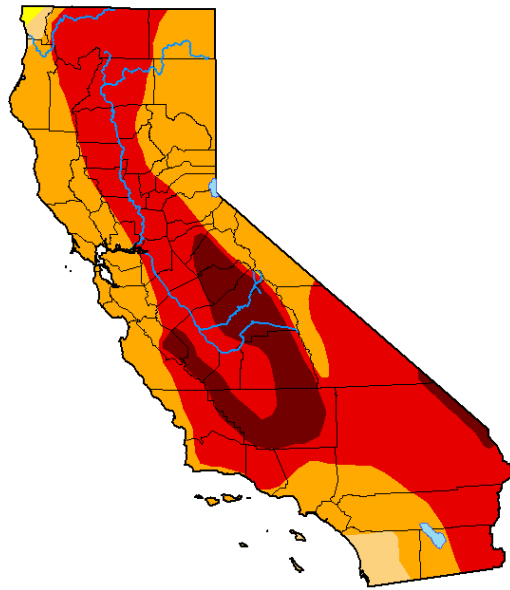

WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

- Outdoor watering only allowed on Tuesdays, Thursdays, & Saturdays between 8 p.m.-8 a.m. (with exceptions such as hand-watering)
- No excess runoff from outdoor watering
- No hosing down driveways, sidewalks, buildings, or parking lots
- No washing vehicles without a shut-off nozzle
- No using water in fountains or other water features without recirculation
- No watering during rain and 24 hours following
- Fix leaks within seven (7) days of discovery
- No watering non-functional turf on commercial, industrial & institutional properties

TIMELINE

10/19/21 – Governor issues Drought Emergency Proclamation for CA

12/15/21 – MVWD declares Significant Water Supply Shortage (Stage 2)

3/28/22 – Governor issues Executive Order, calling on local water agencies to move to Level 2 of their Water Shortage Contingency Plans and directing the State Water Board to consider banning irrigation of non-functional turf

4/26/22 – Metropolitan Water District declares a Water Shortage Emergency for SWP-dependent areas & restricts outdoor watering to one day per week.

5/24/22 – State Water Board adopts Emergency Regulations designated in Governor's Executive Order issued 3/28/22
